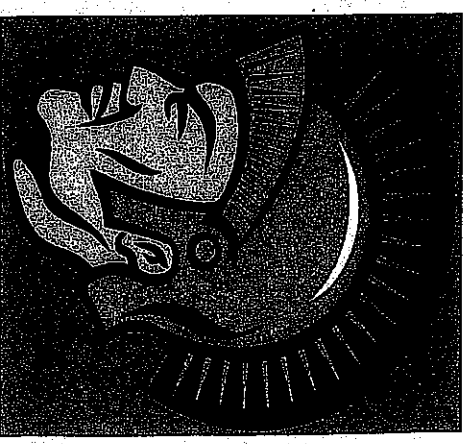

UDA MISSION STATEMENT

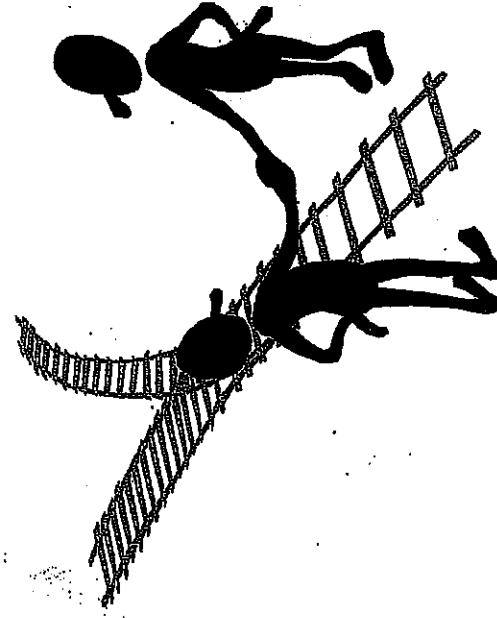
The mission of the Upper Dauphin Area Elementary School Student Assistance Program is to insure that our student's emotional and physical needs are met, enabling them to reach their full potential.

PURPOSE OF ELEMENTARY STUDENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

1. To identify students who are experiencing barriers to learning and school success.
2. To intervene and refer these students to appropriate school and community resources.
3. To monitor identified students and gather data necessary for assessment.

REFERRAL

Student referrals to the Elementary Student Assistance Program may be made by parents/guardians, the administrator, teachers and other school staff, other students, and by self-referral of a student experiencing difficulty.



We Need You

If you feel that your child may need help, call school and ask to speak with an ESAP team member.

The ESAP team will help you find services and assistance within the school and, if needed, in the community. We do not diagnose, treat, or refer your child for treatment. We will provide you with information; **you** make the choice.

After you give permission, the ESAP team will gather confidential information about your child's school performance from his/her teachers. A ESAP team member will also talk with you about your observations, your child's strengths, and your concerns. Together, you and the ESAP team will develop a plan of action to help your child achieve success in school. The plan may include services and activities in school and/or services from a community agency. If necessary, the ESAP team will talk with you about services in the community and give you information on how to contact others who may be able to help.

The ESAP team will continue to work with and support your child. Please know that your continued involvement is very important, and you and your child's privacy will be respected
