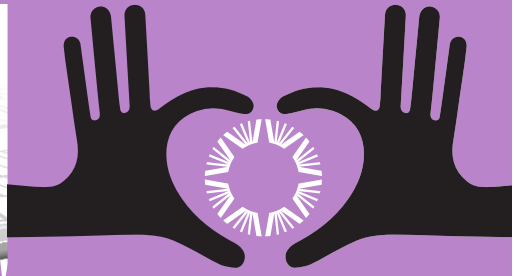

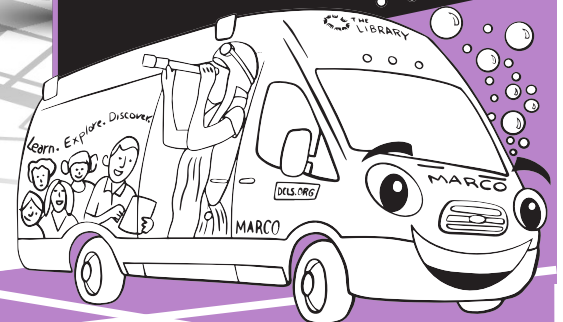

For most recurring children's programs, register once and you're registered for all events following.

For virtual programs, please be sure to include your email address for a library employee to contact you with more information and any links you need to join. If you registered for a recurring virtual program, you'll be contacted weekly with a link to the program.

In Conversation with Pennsylvania's Poet Laureates

We are very pleased to welcome Philadelphia's newest poet laureate, Aira Dee Matthews.

Aira D. Matthews' first collection of poems is the critically acclaimed *Simulacra*, which received the prestigious 2016 Yale Series of Younger Poets Award. The collection explores the topics of longing and desire with power, insight, and intense emotion. Matthews received a 2020 Pew Fellowship, a 2016 Rona Jaffe Foundation Writers' Award, and was awarded the Louis Untermeyer Scholarship in Poetry from the 2016 Bread Loaf Writers' Conference.

Aira will be joined in conversation by Rick Kearns-Morales, named Poet Laureate of the City of Harrisburg in 2014. Rick Kearns-Morales is a poet, freelance writer and musician of Puerto Rican (Spanish/Taino) and European background based in Harrisburg. Much of his work deals with his Puerto Rican heritage and identity, including his feelings about his Taino heritage. He has performed his work accompanied by the Con Alma Quartet on various occasions from 2010 to 2014. These performances featured the blending of Kearns' poetry with established jazz tunes that typically include improvised interactions between the poet and the musicians.
